Sunday, April 19th The Octave of Easter Divine Mercy Sunday

Jesus told St. Faustina that "on this day, the very depths of My tender mercy are opened. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy."

Our Lord promised to grant complete forgiveness of sins and punishment on the *Feast of Divine Mercy* (the Sunday after Easter).

To observe the *Feast of Divine Mercy* we should:

- Sincerely **repent** of all of our sins
- Place our complete **trust** in Jesus
- Go to **Confession** (this year, make a sincere **Act of Contrition**, then go to **Confession** as soon as possible)
- Receive Holy Communion (this year, if needed, make a Spiritual Communion, then receive Communion as soon as possible)
- Venerate the image of Divine Mercy
- Be merciful to others thru our actions, words and prayers
- **Pray** a Divine Mercy Novena starting on Good Friday
