

Stations of the Cross

The Stations of the Cross, also known as the Way of the Cross, Via Crucis, and Via Dolorosa (Latin for Way of Sorrows), is a devotion that reflects on Jesus' final days on Earth—from being condemned to death to dying on the cross and being placed in the tomb. The Stations of the Cross consist of a series of 14 artistic renderings that typically line the interior walls of every Catholic Church. These illustrations capture key moments during Jesus' journey to His death on Good Friday.

It's often said that you must walk a mile in someone's shoes to understand what they are going through. This moving devotion is a way for us to "walk" in Jesus' shoes while allowing us to pray and meditate on each of the events (stations) that Jesus experienced.

Please join us at 5:00 each Friday during Lent to pray the Stations of the Cross.

**Next Friday, March 4 is also "First Friday".

Stations of the Cross will be recited at 5:45 pm after 5:00 pm Mass.

Stations of The Cross

- 1. Jesus is Condemned to Die
- 2. Jesus carries His cross
- 3. Jesus falls the first time
- 4. Jesus meets His mother Mary
- 5. Simon helps Jesus carry His cross
- 6. Veronica wipes Jesus' face
- 7. Jesus falls for the second time
- 8. Jesus meets the women of Jerusalem
- 9. Jesus falls for the third time
- 10. Jesus is stripped
- 11. Jesus is nailed to the cross
- 12. Jesus dies on the cross
- 13. Jesus is taken down from the Cross
- 14. Jesus is laid in the tomb.





LENT IS COMING!
