

When I am driving throughout the United States, I enjoy seeing the billboards that dot the highways speaking for God. A couple of my favorites: "Life is short. PALM BRANCHES FROM LAST YEAR

Next week, you will be offered palm branches on Palm Sunday. Oftentimes, these are used to display in your home perhaps to tuck behind a religious picture or crucifix. They serve as a constant reminder of Palm Sunday and are a beautiful way to stay connected to Holy Week throughout the year. Palm branches are blessed and, therefore, become "sacramentals", which are objects that are meant to draw us closer to God. Blessed items are to be treated with respect and reverence and should not be discarded in the trash; throwing them in the trash overlooks their sacred purpose. Canon law states anything that is blessed should be burned (and the ashes buried or spread outside) or buried. This type of disposal honors their sacred purpose and returns them to earth in a dignified manner.
