

Many Catholics from around the world participate in the ages old tradition of the Seven Churches Visitation often referring to it as a "mini-pilgrimage" which starts after the Mass of the Lords Supper on Holy Thursday. This tradition is often credited to St. Philip Neri who lived in the middle 16th century and was approved by Pope Sixtus V in 1586 as an indulgenced devotion.

(Indulgences are believed to be of assistance to a soul immediately after death.) Others argue that this traditional mini pilgrimage is referred to in the Book of Revelation, when the Seven ancient Churches are visited by an angel.

Irregaurdless of its origins this evening pilgrimage from altar to altar is a way for us to spiritually accompany Christ as he enters His Passion.

As Jesus asks of his apostles, in the Garden of Gethsemane, "Could you not spend one hour with me?"

The seven visits represent the final seven places or "stations" Jesus journeyed, from his arrest Holy Thursday to his crucifixion and death on Good Friday.

In each church, the Blessed Sacrament is placed on the Altar of Repose for Adoration. Before the altar, Catholics can meditate on the appropriate Scripture, offer prayers, and spend time with Jesus in adoration.

- Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane (Lk 22:39-46)
- Jesus bound and taken before Annas (Jn 18:19-22)
- Jesus taken before the High Priest, Caiaphas (Mt 26:63-65)
- Jesus taken before Pilate (Jn 18:35-37)
- Jesus taken before Herod (Lk 23:8-9; 11)
- Jesus taken before Pilate again (Mt 27:22-26)
- Jesus given the Crown of Thorns and led to His crucifixion 9mt 27;27-31

Thus, they went out to meet him, carrying branches of palm and shouting, "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord, the King of Israel."
