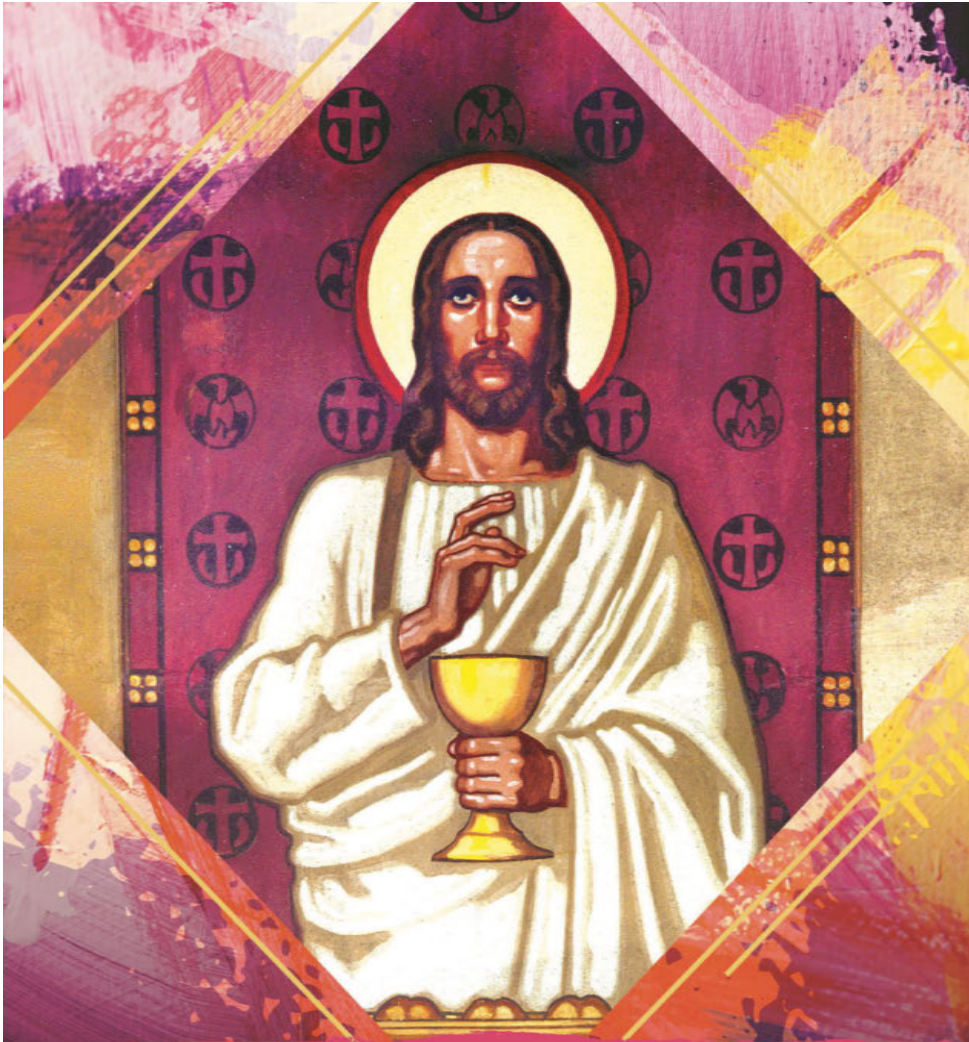

The Feast of Corpus Christi

Instituted in the 13th century as a result of the Eucharistic dedication of an extraordinarily faithful nun, St. Juliana of Liège.

St. Juliana of Liège was born in 1191 in the village of Retinnes, Liège, in the eastern region of Belgium. She loved Christ and had a deep sense of His presence, often contemplating on the words of Jesus,

“And lo, I am with you always, to the close of the age” (Matthew 28:20).”

At sixteen, she experienced her first of many visions during Eucharistic adoration. She would see the moon in its full brilliance with a dark stripe across it. During the vision, the Lord made it known to her that the moon was a symbol of the life of the Church here on earth, and the dark line was the absence of a liturgical feast.

The Lord revealed that she should plead for a special feast so that the Eucharist can be adored, which would lead to increased faith, practice of virtues and seeking reparation for sin to the Most Holy Sacrament.

After 20 years of silence she finally confided in two friends Eva and Isabella both who shared love and devotion to the most holy Sacrament. Most saints go through a period of hardship in their lives and Sister Juliana was no exception. She endured harsh opposition from some clergy and her superior making her life difficult.

She left the convent of her own free will, never speaking ill or criticizing those who stood against her. Instead she stayed the course and continued to be obedient and stalwart in her desire to spread Eucharistic adoration until her death in 1258.

The Archdeacon in Liège, Jacques Pantaleon of Troyes was convinced of Juliana’s cause to institute the Feast of Corpus Christi. He would later become Pope Urban IV and instituted the Solemnity of Corpus Christi on the Thursday after the Most Holy Trinity as a feast of precept for the universal Church in 1264. He wrote:

“The Eucharist is celebrated solemnly every day, it is fitting to celebrate yearly with greater honor and a solemn commemoration. Indeed, we grasp the other things we commemorate with our spirit and our mind, but this does not mean that we obtain their real presence. On the contrary, in this sacramental commemoration of Christ, even though in a different form, Jesus Christ is present with us in his own substance. While he was about to ascend into Heaven he said those words she contemplated so often, ‘And lo, I am with you always, to the close of the age’ (Matthew 28:20).” Courtesy of The Diocese of Liège

Happy Feast Day to our Patron Saint - St. Anthony of Padua

Saint Anthony of Padua (August 15th 1195 – June 13th 1231) was a Portuguese Catholic priest and Franciscan friar who became a saint in 1232 and was made a Doctor of the Church in 1946.

Also known as Anthony of Lisbon, he is the patron saint of Portugal as well as the patron saint of people who lose things and of children. Many miracles are assigned to Saint Anthony and he is often referred to as the 'The Saint of Miracles' or 'the Wonder Worker'.

St. Anthony of Padua was born in Lisbon, Portugal on August 15, 1195. He was ordained as a priest and became inspired after meeting five Franciscan friars who were on their way to Muslim Morocco to preach the Gospel. A few months later he discovered that the monks were martyred and he joined the Franciscan order to follow in their path, adopting the name of Anthony, after Anthony the Great, who was one of the first monks and noted for his travels in desert lands.

Anthony's life was changed when he was forced into giving a sermon. This uncovered his great gift for speech making which led to Saint Francis asking him to travel around Italy preaching the Gospel which he did. He converted many people and became famed for his sermons.

He was canonized less than a year after his death by Pope Gregory IX on May 30th 1232. This is the second-fastest canonization ever.
