



October is Right to Life Month, a time in which we thank God for the gift of life and strive to live our lives to the fullest and to help and protect those whose lives are threatened. Fr. Mike Newman, OSFS says this about Right to Life Month.

One way that our lives are constantly threatened is by addiction. Addiction is a modern name and description for what the Bible often calls "sin" and that medieval Christians called "passions" and "attachments." St. Paul described this best in Romans when he wrote: "I do not understand my own behavior. I fail to carry out the very things I want to do, and I find myself doing the very things I hate...For although the will to do what is good is within me, the performance is not" (Rom 7:15, 18). The Bible and medieval Christians (like St. Thomas Aquinas and St. Catherine of Siena) replied that serious measures or practices were needed to break out of these illusions and transcend them. The Christian word for this is "conversion."

We are all addicts to something, which is another way of saying that we are all sinners. We also, if we are honest, have an intense resistance to change. We like life to be predictable and that's one reason that addicts find it easier to have a relationship with a substance or a process rather than with people. Unlike substances, people are unpredictable. Having a drink, buying something, surfing the dark side of the internet or turning to our devices can change our mood very quickly, and though that mood shift doesn't last, it can make us feel like we are in control for a little while. We don't have to change our way of thinking or being in a relationship with others. We don't have to sit with our boredom, discomfort, or anger which stops our ability to grow up and ultimately to change and become the women and men God calls us to be.


