

#### WHAT EVERY CATHOLIC SHOULD KNOW

#### THE ADVENT WREATH - TRADITION & MEANING

Advent wreaths are a favorite way to celebrate the month of December leading up to Christmas Day and are filled with rich meaning and symbolism, reminding us that we are to shine and be the light of Christ in this world.

The circular shape of the wreath has no beginning or end, symbolizing God's complete and unending love for us. It also represents eternal life which becomes ours through faith in Jesus Christ.

On the wreath are four candles, three purple, the color symbolizing penance, preparation, and sacrifice, and one pink, this color symbolizing joy. Some Advent wreaths include a fifth candle, white in color representing purity – for Christ our King and is lit on Christmas Eve (or Day.) As the Messiah's "Advent" (or "coming") draws nearer another candle is lit, dispelling more darkness demonstrating the contrast between darkness and light, just as Jesus dispels the darkness of sin:

"I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness but will have the light of life" (John 8:12).

Purple is the primary candle color associated with Advent. Within the Catholic Church it symbolizes penance, sacrifice, and preparation. During the first week of Advent, we remember the Old Testament prophets who foretold of Jesus' coming with hope and anticipation; therefore, the first candle is known as the "Prophecy Candle," the HOPE candle.

During the second week of Advent, we reflect on our lives and work to become better versions of ourselves as we prepare for Jesus' coming, while remembering the journey Joseph and Mary took from Nazareth to Bethlehem. Therefore, the second candle, referred to as the Bethlehem Candle, is the PEACE candle representing Peace and Preparation.

This third candle is pink and is the candle of JOY. During this week of Advent, we are filled with joy and excitement as we near the arrival of Jesus on Christmas Day. On this Sunday, often called "Gaudete Sunday" we reflect on the JOY that the shepherd's felt at the birth of Jesus.

The 4th and final Sunday of Advent the remaining purple candle is lit. This candle called the "Angel's Candle" symbolizes PEACE and reminds us of the message of the angels that day: "Peace on Earth, Good Will Toward Men."

#### The Tradition of Oplatky

Once again, this year we will be selling "<u>BLESSED</u>" Oplatky in the vestibule after all Masses.

The European tradition of sharing Oplatky began with a simple wafer, baked from flour and water and is shared before the Christmas Eve meal.

The eldest member of the family begins by breaking off a piece of the wafer and passing it to another family member with a blessing. This blessing can simply be a wish for your loved one in the upcoming year – good health, success, or happiness. This simple act expresses one's love and forgiveness for each member of their family.

Just as we share in the Eucharist as one family in Christ receiving His love through the Eucharist, the Oplatky invites our family to come together and share the love they have for one another.

Consider starting this tradition with your family.


